The Center hosted its partners in the ADTKD-MUC1 project, coordinated by Dr Gregoris Papagregoriou and Dr Christoforos Stavrou.

The leader of this project Dr Anna Greka (Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard, Massachusetts, USA), Dr Anthony J. Bleyer (Wake Forest Medical School, North Carolina, USA), and Dr Stanislav Kmoch with Dr Martina Zivna and Dr Petr Vylet'al (Charles University, Prague, CZ), visited Cyprus along with the world-renowned researcher and pioneer in kidney disease therapeutics Dr Peter Mundel.

After having a productive meeting with researchers at biobank.cy in Nicosia, our visitors attended a meeting with Cypriot patients in Pafos, to present recent advances in finding an effective treatment for ADTKD-MUC1 (Ελληνικά).


